FISCAL IMPACT

The Facility Master Plan is proceeding under an existing agreement between the City and Black & Veatch. All work is included in the existing budget per the agreement.

DISCUSSION

Matt Thomas, PE, Black & Veatch's Engineering Manager for the Facility Master Plan (FMP), will be available to receive comments on Technical Memoranda No.6 and provide a high level overview of Technical Memorandum No. 7 to WRFCAC.

Technical Memoranda will be completed throughout November and December, in anticipation of completion of the draft FMP. These Memoranda will be complemented by technical workshops and community workshops offered in December and January, as discussed in the Outreach Plan.

Schedule for the draft FMP will be coordinated with property negotiation and preliminary agreement with an owner on terms and conditions. Additional geotechnical studies are being conducted at this time to address the southwest area of the MacElvaine property and the program management team is evaluating other site alternatives. A schedule update will be provided in December after preliminary

findings from these studies are available.

A draft of Technical Memorandum No. 7 (Liquid Treatment Evaluation) will be provided at this meeting for review and comment by WRFCAC members. A joint WRFCAC/City Council study session has also been scheduled for December 1 at 4 PM to discuss liquid treatment technologies and preliminary findings.
