## City adopts Utility Discount Program for low-income residents



The City of Morro Bay is pleased to be able to offer a Utility Discount Program to low-income residents. Those customers who qualify for assistance through PG&E's Customer Care Program can also receive a discount from the City.

Qualifying residents will receive a \$8 discount — about 10 percent of a utility bill — monthly. The discount is paid from penalties, charges for non-sufficient checks, and application revenues, so the discount is limited to that pot of money.

Signing up is simple: Register with PG&E's Customer Care program, fill out the City's application, attach a copy of your current PG&E bill and submit the package to the Administrative Services Department.

## City adds new incentives for water conservation



City Council members in July adopted a new set of water conservation incentives that provide discounts for everything from water-saving irrigation control, rain barrel use, and "cash for grass."

The discounts range from \$25 to \$500 depending on the incentive. The City already offered rebates for low-flow toilets and resource-efficient washing machines, and those incentives will also continue.
